Heritage College & Seminary seeks to glorify God by partnering with churches in providing a biblically based education; equipping people for life and ministry in the church and in the world.




Current Reality

1) Upgrade the Campus


Present Heritage as a top-choice school in Canada for those preparing for ministry.

Expand the number of our faithful supporters, to enable us to thrive for years to come.





